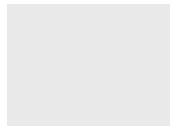

What is UShareNH?

Neighbors helping neighbors to build a better life

A web-based tool designed to help social service workers find resources for their clients in their communities. It was created by two NH pastors – one with an IT background; the other, a foster/adoptive parent experienced in working with the state. UShare is built on the premise that neighbors will help with needs in their community before they will donate goods and services to people they don't know in other communities. Here, then, is an opportunity to expand resource capacity.

A Network for every social service worker in the state of NH whether employed by State, Community or Faith-based organizations. The response to Katrina and Rita showed the ability of small community organizations to make a difference when mobilized. UShare can help to do the same.

A Powerful Tool to strengthen the fabric of our local communities. Empowering neighbors to help meet needs locally will have a rippling effect throughout the community.

How UShareNH Works?

People, like you, register choosing what types of needs you want to be alerted of and services you would like to offer.

State, Community and Faith-based social service workers place a request based on a client's need. The request triggers an **ActionAlert** to UShare members which fit both geographic and category criteria as established by their Member Profiles. This ensures that UShare members will only be contacted with needs they choose to be informed about.

Members can respond to the need, or not, as necessary contact information will be provided in the **ActionAlert**. It will be the responsibility of the social worker who posts the need to vet any offers of assistance. Once the vetting process is complete, the connection can be made and the need met. In some cases, a team of resource providers can be coordinated by the social worker.

Each completed "Share" will trigger another email to the original group thanking those who stepped up to meet the need. This will strengthen the fabric of the UShare Network and encourage others to participate in future opportunities.

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
